### Why Our Work Matters

Rural communities like Yazoo City and Belzoni face significant maternal health challenges:

- Long distances to hospitals equipped for labor and delivery
- Limited access to OB/GYNs and prenatal care providers
- High levels of disadvantages and underinsurance
- Transportation barriers and poor health literacy

These issues lead to late prenatal care initiation and increased risks of complications such as preeclampsia, preterm labor, and maternal morbidity.

- Integrated primary and specialty care
- Community-based education on prenatal health, infant care, and family planning
- Telehealth services to reduce travel burdens and expand care access

### Our Community Approach

- Rural, low-income, and underserved populations
- Women of childbearing age (teens through mid-40s)
- Pregnant women, postpartum mothers, and women planning for pregnancy
